Steeple Claydon Update - Addison Road Overbridge

Temporary highway reinstatement

- Working collaboratively with BC & HS2
- Road Safety Audit (RSA3) to be completed in collaboration with BC.
- Approved method statement required, up to date with TB risk information.
- Consent then given by natural England.
- Specialist to visit site in late this week/early next week to install non return mesh, 21 days waiting period then starts, peanut trials can be used.
- Completion of temporary crossing W/C 15 Aug.


Calvert Update

- There are various large ponds excavated around the area as well for water collection.






Calvert Green – Noise and Dust Monitoring




Calvert Area

- Concerns about Fusion utility works HGVs (not EKFB related)
- Complaint TM vehicle parking in front of residents houses.


This month we received compliments on:





Traffic Survey – Egdcott (Total 8-9:30am)




Traffic Survey – Egdcott (8-9am)

- After the winter storms, a significant amount of rubbish from the nearest waste facility flew over to EKFB's site in Sheephouse Wood
- Set by the ancient woodland, the site is where the Bat Mitigation Structure will be constructed
- In total, 14 bags of rubbish were picked by the team, and taken to the nearest compound for safe disposal
