The design changes have reduced the amount of land required for the IMD buildings by approximately 33%.

Habitat connections


The landscape design, within and around the IMD, seeks to sustain habitat corridors to Calvert Jubilee Nature Reserve, Sheephouse Wood, the chain of woodlands within Claydon Bowl and the wider habitat network.



Construction

- Before the IMD is constructed, a railhead will be built on the same site.
- The railhead at Calvert will be the central hub for getting materials onto the trace to enable the rail systems contractor to construct the railway.
- Materials will be delivered to the railhead by rail and stored, before being distributed by rail along the HS2 route.
- The railhead will be converted into the IMD when no longer required.
