

HS2 E Update May 2021

What is Buckinghamshire Council doing on behalf of residents?

Buckinghamshire Council and Chilterns Conservation Board have raised concerns about the impact of HS2's tunnelling operations on Buckinghamshire's aquifer and chalk streams and have asked a number of questions of HS2 Ltd/contractors. You can read the full position statement here:

The Council is carefully monitoring the impacts of an HS2 concrete batching plant being constructed at Calvert. Environmental Health Officers will be measuring any noise and dust impacts. See press release below:

Council officers meet monthly with senior Department for Transport HS2 officials to discuss various issues.

Recruitment is underway for 2 local HS2/EWR Traffic Marshalls who will be mobile, working with the HS2 contractors Traffic Control Site Officers (TCSOs) to resolve issues which are within the Council's powers. These officers will also need to work with the DfT inspectors, East West Rail Traffic Ambassadors and HS2 Traffic Control and Safety Officers.

HS2 Ltd/Align still need to close the A413 for weekend working to carry out utility works. Buckinghamshire Council is continuing to discuss plans for these proposed works to cause the least disruption possible. We have worked with HS2 Ltd/Align to reduce the impact by limiting the works to a single weekend. This is now proposed to take place in June.

The Schedule 17 application determination for the Wendover Dean Viaduct has been extended at the request of Buckinghamshire Council so that additional information is provided in relation to drainage, hydrogeology and noise.

Buckinghamshire Council is leading work with other Phase 1 Highways Authorities to reach a highway condition and maintenance agreement with HS2 Ltd.

Tunnel Boring Machine (TBM) is launched heading northwards beneath The Chilterns

The boring machine launched on 13 May and will operate 24 hours a day, it will take around three years for the tunnel boring machine (TBM), called Florence, to dig the 10-mile long tunnel under the Chiltern hills.

At 170 metres in length, the 2,000 tonne TBM is also the largest ever used on a UK rail project. As is traditional, all TBMs are given female names, and Florence is named after Florence Nightingale – a name suggested by local children due to her residence at nearby Claydon House in Bucks.

High Speed Rail Act 2017 Schedule 17 Statutory Guidance published 5 May 2021

The purpose of the Guidance is to provide further information and guidance to all planning authorities that will determine a request for approval under Schedule 17 to the Act. The Guidance also highlights the key differences in the processes and controls conferred to planning authorities under Schedule 17 and the powers they use to routinely determine applications for planning permission under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

St Mary's Church, Stoke Mandeville

Archaeologists have been working in Buckinghamshire on the HS2 project and are excavating a medieval church and burial ground in Stoke Mandeville.

The Old St Mary's Church was built in 1080AD, shortly after the Norman conquest and may have been at first the private chapel belonging to the lord of the manor at that time.

There will be a field museum and open days so that local people can learn more about any discoveries.
